REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL ACCESSIBLE PLAYGROUND SYSTEM

The Springfield Park District is soliciting proposals for design and procurement of an Accessible Playground System to be installed in Douglas Park.

Basic Design Requirements

- Design for children 5-16 years of age
- A variety of different types of non-traditional, unique, modern and trendy play experiences for young and older participants.
- Design elements may include: Musical Elements, Swings, Fitness or Obstacle features, Zip Line Feature.
- System to comply with ADA, CPSC and ASTM, IPEMA guidelines
- The maximum dollar amount allocated to this project is \$100,000. Any bid more than \$100,000 will be automatically rejected.
- Post supports, decks and railings to be color coated aluminum or galvanized steel



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- The system should be designed to be located in an area approximately 75' x 75'
- Ground level play events, both active and passive at quantities to exceed ADA requirements desired.

Submittal Requirements

- Proposals shall include a breakdown of play components identifying the number and type of play events and number of accessible play events both elevated and at ground level. - Compliance with minimum requirements as described in the Basic Design Requirements section of the Request for Proposal
- Quantity of play events
- Quality or play value of proposed play events
- Design creativity and physical appeal of proposed system
- Overall quality of proposal

An interview may be requested to aid in the selection of a supplier. The award will be made to the qualified supplier whose proposal is deemed most advantageous to the Springfield Park District.
